PUMPKIN GINGERBREAD



Ingredients: 3 cups sugar, 1 cup Vegetable oil, 4 eggs, 2/3 cup water, 1 (15 oz.) Pumpkin Puree, 2 teaspoons ground ginger, 1 teaspoon ground allspice, 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon, 1 teaspoon ground cloves, 3 ½ cups all purpose flour, 2 teaspoons baking soda, 1 ½ teaspoons salt, ½ teaspoons salt

Directions:

Step 1: Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease two 9x5 inch loaf pans

Step 2: In a large mixing, combine sugar, oil and eggs; beat until smooth. Add water and beat until well blended. Stir in pumpkin, ginger, allspice cinnamon, and clove.

Step 3: In medium bowl, combine flour, soda, salt, and baking powder. Add dry ingredients to pumpkin mixture and blend just until all ingredients are mixed. Divide batter between prepared pans.

Step 4: Bake in preheated oven until toothpick comes out clean, about 1 hour.

Turbo-Charged Toboggan



On November 22, 1927, Carl Eliason patented his Motor Toboggan after years of experimentation, giving rise to the invention of the snowmobile.

Eliason, having grown up in Wisconsin, was an avid outdoorsman, but he suffered a foot disability that prevented him from snowshoeing. So, in 1924, the 24-year-old Eliason decided to attach a pair of skis to the front of a toboggan outfitted with an outboard motor that powered a steel track. His “motor toboggan” became the world’s first primitive snowmobile. After receiving the patent, Eliason went on to build 50 of the machines, each one an individual work of art. When an order for 150 came in from Finland, he sold the rights to a major manufacturer. The U.S. Army even ordered 150 of the machines to help soldiers defend Alaska’s wild and wintry backcountry.
